2016 Legislative Update

The 2016 session of the Georgia General Assembly saw a number of controversial bills debated and ultimately passed. Despite a heavy Republican majority in both the House and Senate, Governor Deal went against many in his own party by vetoing more than a dozen bills, including the highly controversial "religious liberty" bill (HB 757). Of particular interest to many ACA members, he also vetoed HB 216, which was a controversial bill that would have impacted workers compensation claims for firefighters and could have potentially lead to expanded occupational disease claims in the workers compensation setting.

Much of the early part of the session was dominated by a push for casino gambling. While that effort died in committee, it is surely not the last we have heard from its proponents. The headlines quickly turned to the so called "religious liberty" bill. After a lengthy and heated debate, it was eventually passed. However, after seeing the economic backlash experienced by several other States that had passed similar bills, Governor Deal went against many in his own party by vetoing the bill. He also vetoed the controversial "campus carry" bill (HB859), although he signed into law a similar bill allowing for non-lethal weapons, such as Tasers, on college campuses.

As for legislation of interest to the ACA membership, HB 216 was at the top of most people's radar. It had actually been debated in the 2015 session, and the bill that passed this year was a compromise bill that was thought to be much more palatable to the business community. However, after a heavy lobbying effort, Governor Deal vetoed the legislation. HB 934 was also passed and signed into law. It limits the ability of engineers, architects and surveyors to indemnify others for their own negligence. SB 137 was also passed and signed into law, which expands valuation standards for residential property destroyed by fire to property owned by legal entities (it was previously limited to property owned by a "natural person").

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
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
